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Medical Center in Las Vegas offers natural alternatives to patients when conventional methods have failed

“The primary objective of all conscientious physicians should be to cure the sick, prevent others from becoming ill, and raise the standard of health in all people, stated Dr. Royal. “Traditional or allopathic medicine strives to accomplish this by labeling individuals who have similar symptoms with a name or diagnosis. Allopathic medicine believes the possibility of cure depends upon the certainty of diagnosis. For this reason, an oft-repeated medical school adage says, ‘The name of the game is the name.’ However, I find that most patients want more than a name. They want to be well.”

According to Dr. Royal, a licensed osteopathic and homeopathic physician in Nevada, while a homeopathic physician recognizes the need for scientific training, diagnostic procedures, and interpretation of laboratory data, his focus is primarily on the individual patient’s physical, mental, and emotional reactions to his illness. In other words, the homeopathic patient is viewed as an entire individual, not just labeled with a specific disease.

As a homeopathic physician, Dr. Royal focuses his efforts on treating the sick person rather than a diagnosis, which is a fundamental difference between homeopathic and allopathic medicine. Consequently, different patients suffering with the same disease may require different homeopathic remedies for their symptoms, while other patients with different diseases may all benefit from the same remedy.

The homeopathic remedies Dr. Royal uses at New Hope Medical Center are distinguished from pharmaceutical drugs in that they have been diluted, often to the point where no original source material remains, and they have been shaken through a process called “succession”. The process of succession puts kinetic energy into the remedy and thus, creates an energy medicine that resonates with the body’s own biorhythms to gently restore balance within. As a result,

substances, which in their natural state have little or no obvious effects upon the human body (e.g., sand, charcoal, salt, etc.), develop powerful healing properties in a dilute, but energized, form.

Although the basic fundamentals of homeopathy have been known and used by physicians for more than 2000 years, it was not until the end of the 18th century that a German doctor, Samuel Hahnemann, discovered the Law of Similars (e.g., “like cures like”) and made homeopathy into a medical science. Hahnemann’s theory was that a homeopathic remedy cures by stimulating a body’s reaction to illness, which is in opposition to traditional medicines that act to suppress the body’s symptoms.

“The practice of homeopathy is a natural healing approach that stimulates the body by enhancing the body’s own energy needed to eliminate negative influences such as viruses, bacteria, and toxins,” continued Dr. Royal. “When properly applied, homeopathy is simple, safe, effective, and without side-effects. In fact, for over 200 years now, both homeopathic physicians and their patients have been amply rewarded.”
